Greetings Michigan State Bar Foundation,

Victoria Camille is a Detroit organizer and advocate for community control, accountability, and transparency in police. She is deeply committed to collectively creating safe neighborhoods that include alternatives to police, mutual aid, relationships, holistic wellness, food sovereignty, engagement, responsibility, respect, and learning. In response to neighbors' desire for a safer and cleaner neighborhood, she co-founded of the Grand River Community Block Club in 2020 and served as president for 5 years. Victoria has collaborated with organizations like the Coalition for Police Transparency and Accountability (CPTA), the Detroit Alliance Against Racists and Political Repression (DAARPR), and Wayne Law for over 5 years to educate communities around using their voice and power to hold police accountable and shape community-led safety systems. Victoria has been a member of the National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement (NACOLE) since 2022 and served as the appointed Secretary to the Detroit Board of Police Commissioners in 2023. In November 2025, Victoria was elected by her District 7 neighbors to serve as a member of the Board of Police Commissioners starting January 1, 2026.

Effective civilian oversight requires a community that is informed, engaged, and heard. Unfortunately, the Detroit Board of Police Commissioners is not explicitly mandated by the City Charter to and thus is not currently structured or resourced to provide the robust constituent services, education, and engagement platform required to empower civilian oversight of police in Detroit. In response to these shortfalls, Victoria created the Victoria 4

Your Voice platform with a mission to increase community education, engagement, and input particularly around community safety practices and police policy. This includes what roles police should and should not be playing in our everyday lives; and advocating for alternatives that center people and prevention.

Victoria 4 Your Voice consistently publishes monthly digital and printed Zines educating on the following topics:

- Happy New Year & The Basics (Jan)
- Police Misconduct (Feb)
- Our Community Safety Toolbox (Mar)
- Know Your Rights (Apr)
- Severe Misconduct: Terminations vs Last Chance Agreements (May)

In addition, Victoria 4 Your Voice maintains a resource and education website (<https://www.victoria4yourvoice.com/>) and is launching in person office hours sessions.

Victoria 4 Your Voice is supported by volunteers and funded by Victoria's personal funds for digital platforms, printing, food for volunteer and community events, etc. We do not solicit and are not currently accepting grants or donations of any kind.

We look forward to continuing to work with Wayne Law to provide community education around civilian oversight; and fully support the launching of the Community Outreach and Engagement program.
